DESCRIPTION

The plan, developed through an inclusive community design process, will be a tool to assist the City of Santa Rosa and the Community to identify those key Capital Improvement Projects (CIPs) in the Courthouse Square Area which will maintain Downtown as the major regional office, financial, civic, and cultural center in the North Bay with a stronger sense of place. The Courthouse Square Reunification will close Santa Rosa Avenue through the square, re-establishing it as the heart of the community with a centralized 1.5-acre green. The recommended Transit Mall enhancements consist of a "hub of parks" which build
